However, after reflecting on the conversation and because of something I have just learned this past weekend, I still feel I need to talk with you in person, at least briefly, if you can possibly find a few minutes to give me.

I am sorry to be so mysterious, but what I have learned involves the security of Church documents and seems to me to require that I speak with you briefly in absolute confidence.

Let me assure you again that I am not seeking an opportunity to discuss any issues or to vindicate myself in some way. But I do still feel a need, as I expressed to you in my letter last May, to get counsel from you about how to convey accurately and fully my spirit and devotion to the Kingdom and how to serve more effectively with the gifts I seem to have been given. Even in your generous remarks to me over the phone and report of comments by another, I felt that same reservation about the state of my soul and the quality of my contributions that I need to understand more fully and do something about.
